3. To assist local hospitals and blood banks in maintaining an adequate and reliable blood supply for emergency situations.

**REPORT**

On 14th December 2025, Clara's College of Commerce successfully organized its 25th Blood Donation Camp in association with the Mahatma Gandhi Blood Centre. The initiative aimed to serve the community by collecting blood for patients in need. The blood donation drive was graced by Ms. Padmini Kolhapure as the Chief Guest. She formally inaugurated the event by cutting the ribbon and was warmly felicitated by the General Secretary of Clara's College of Commerce, Shri Ajay Kaul Sir. Many esteemed guests like Hon'ble Shri. Gajanan Kirtikarji, Former Member of Parliament, Dr. Bharti Lavekarji, Former MLA, Hon'ble Shri. Hanumant Gosaviji, Asst. Superintendent of Gardens, M.C.G.M., Smt. Kalpana Gadekarji, ACP DN Nagar Division, Shri. Mohsin Haiderji, Former Municipal Councillor graced the drive with their presence.


**Report on the Celebration of Republic Day**

Report: Industrial Visit to the Go Cheese Factory located at Manchar, Pune

Date: 8th February 2026.

#### Report:

An industrial visit was organised by our college to the Go Cheese Factory, located at Manchar, Pune, on 8th February 2026. The objectives of this visit were-

- To gain practical knowledge about the dairy industry and to understand the manufacturing process of various dairy products.
- To provide practical knowledge of industrial working conditions.
- To gain awareness about industrial safety measures and precautions.
- To understand discipline, teamwork, and professional behavior at the workplace.
- To develop interest in industrial careers and entrepreneurship.

We departed from the college at around 6:00 a.m. by two buses. Bus No.1 was allotted for 47 students and three teachers namely Mr. Vijaykumar Makwana, Mrs. Ruchita Pandhare, Mrs. Samina Chaudhary and Bus No. 2 was allotted for remaining 45 students and three teachers namely Mr. Reetesh R Singh, Dr. Babita Kanojia, Mrs. Kajal Jaiswal.

During the journey, we had our breakfast at predecided venue and then continued towards the factory. We reached the factory premises at approximately 12:00 noon.

Upon arrival, the factory officials conducted an informative presentation. They explained the background of the company and informed about their major products such as Go Cheese and Avatar Protein. Detailed information regarding product quality, production standards, and overall production capacity was also shared with us.

After the presentation, lunch arrangements were made by the company. A variety of food items prepared using their dairy products were served. Following lunch, we visited the main dairy farm from where milk is supplied to the factory. There, we learned about the specific cow breeds used for high-quality milk production. Our host explained the cows' feeding schedules, temperature-controlled environment, and the advanced automated milking machines, where cows are milked without any direct human interference. We were also given fresh milk for tasting. This visit helped us understand how product quality is maintained right from the source.

After completing the farm tour, we were guided to the factory processing unit. Proper safety and hygiene measures were ensured by providing masks, shoe covers, and head caps. Inside the factory, we learned about milk purification and storage, the cheese manufacturing process, whey



protein extraction, and temperature control for different cheese products. We also observed the packaging section and quality testing procedures. Each step of the process was clearly explained by our host.

At the end of the visit, snacks were served. The company also presented us with gift hampers containing their products, which made the visit even more memorable.

We came return to college by 10.45 pm.
